It's hard to believe 2022 has already come and gone! Both for the Kelly Brush Foundation and the Brush family, this past year was a blur. And it felt like every time I turned around, the KBF hit another exciting milestone. Year after year, I am so exceptionally proud of what we are able to accomplish for people with spinal cord injuries, and of the incredible community that has made our work possible.

Not only did we raise over \$1 million at the Kelly Brush Ride, but we also hosted our first ride outside Vermont. For the first time ever, we granted over \$1 million in adaptive sports equipment in a year. We also launched a new scholarship program for first-time sports experiences and launched a brand new version of the Active Project, our digital platform to introduce and engage people in adaptive sports.

On top of all the amazing things we've accomplished this year, I've also started really seeing our work through the lens of my daughters. Not only did adaptive sports change my life, but I now get to watch both of my daughters learn to love sports. As I watch my six-year-old, Dylan, playing a team sport for the first time, I think about what a beautiful gift it is to share with her the love for an active life. And I am so deeply thankful that we have the opportunity to provide that gift to so many, regardless of what active may mean to them.

INJURY TO INDEPENDENCE

A spinal cord injury can be life-altering, restricting, and isolating. For people adjusting to a new life post-injury, the journey back to a new normal can be exhausting and confusing. The KBF uses sports and recreation as a catalyst to build confidence, connect with community, and discover new passions that bring joy and fulfillment to life.

Each of the KBF's signature programs seeks to offer assistance at one of the critical junctions in that journey from injury to independence.

From the instant engagement people can receive with peers and resources through the KBF's digital platform, the **Active Project**, to the in-depth opportunities provided by **Path2Active** scholarships, camps, and clinics, the KBF is shortening the time from injury to first sports experience. And once someone has found the sport they love, and the equipment necessary, the **Active Fund** provides life-changing equipment grants to help them find independence in recreation.

Letter from Edie

In my letter last year, I mentioned three goals for the coming year: granting \$1 million in adaptive sports equipment to people with spinal cord injuries (SCI), hosting three immersive camps to foster community, and launching a new version of the Active Project community platform. I am so excited to return this year and say that we accomplished each of those goals, and so much more. We also owe a massive thank you to every supporter that helped us reach an incredible \$2.7 million in revenue, especially to the 5,700 donors that helped us break \$1 million at the Kelly Brush Ride this year.


As we head into 2023, we have many more goals to share with you, including ones tied to our long-term strategic vision. However, I want to be fully transparent: despite 2022's high hit rate, these are goals, not guarantees. Over the next five years, we are setting extremely aggressive targets that seek to transform the status quo for adaptive sports and life with a spinal cord injury. They will be difficult; they will require massive investment from our dedicated team; and they will not be possible without your support.

We have accomplished so much in the last few years, and have dramatically increased the impact we are able to have on people with SCI across the country. But this is not the finish line; it's just the beginning. The KBF is perfectly positioned, but we have a lot of work to do. Luckily, we have a road map that has led us this far, and an amazing community cheering us on.

Thank you to everyone in the KBF Family for your continued support.

LOOKING 5 YEARS BACK

While the KBF was founded in 2006, it did not have its first full-time employee until 2014. As exciting goals are made and milestones met, it's important to remember how much has happened in only a few years.

In 2018, the KBF:

- **Raised \$1.38 million**, after breaking \$1 million for the first time in 2017.
- Distributed **\$362,000** to 137 grant recipients through the Active Fund.
- Piloted the original **Path2Active** concept nationwide, which provided funding for partner adaptive sports organizations, with 9 programs receiving a total of \$26,000.
- Started a project with its three full-time employees and the board to establish the organization's first multi-year strategic plan.
- Had its first meeting about a potential digital platform to connect people to adaptive sports, the first inkling of the future **Active Project**.

AND 5 YEARS AHEAD

The Kelly Brush Foundation has just finalized a new five-year strategic vision. The KBF Board of Directors voted unanimously to approve this vision at their October meeting.

Over the next 5 years, the KBF plans to:

- **Build partnerships, communications efforts, and resources** to engage with 30% of people with spinal cord injuries within their first year post-injury.
- **Increase awareness** of the Kelly Brush Foundation across the adaptive community, especially in under-served communities.
- **Become leaders** in the efforts to increase outdoor accessibility in recreational spaces.
- **Grow the Active Fund** equipment grants to over \$2 million per year.
- **Diversify sources of revenue** with corporate and recurring giving to improve expense ratios associated with event-based fundraising.


\$1 Million in Equipment Grants Awarded

The Kelly Brush Foundation broke its organizational record this year and awarded over \$1 million in equipment grants! Thanks to your help, 244 people with spinal cord injuries received grants for life-changing adaptive sports equipment.

KBF ADAPTIVE MOUNTAIN BIKING CAMP

For the 2nd Annual KBF aMTB camp, 10 campers joined the KBF staff and many volunteers for three days of skill development, group rides, connection, and community. The beautiful fall foliage combined with the amazing company was an incredible experience that we look forward to continuing year after year.

CRAIG CAMP FOR TEENS

The KBF partnered with Craig Hospital and the University of Utah TRAILS Program to host a camp for injured teens in July. The eight campers had the opportunity to bring a non-parent plus one, combining sports activities like kayaking and mountain biking with a formative social experience. The camp provides teens with the chance to experience new sports in a safe environment and see all that's possible after injury.



TURNS & BERMS CAMP WITH OREGON ADAPTIVE SPORTS

The KBF partnered with Oregon Adaptive Sports to host our inaugural Turns & Berms Camp. The six participants enjoyed three days of outdoor adventure, including the unique opportunity to ski Mount Bachelor in the morning and mountain bike in Bend in the afternoon. 

ACTIVE PROJECT



Based on the results of the Active Project pilot program in 2021, the KBF began development on the launch-ready version of the Active Project. The new platform officially launched for testing at The Hartford's Ski Spectacular adaptive skiing conference in December.


Features of the platform:

- Searchable events calendar


In 2023, the KBF will roll out several more features and start a nationwide launch tour to promote the platform.

MEETING THE GROWING NEED IN SKI RACING SAFETY

This year, the KBF received more requests than ever before through its annual ski racing safety grant program. Programs previously affected by COVID or seeing growth in youth racing desperately needed new b-netting and other course improvements. The KBF was able to make a temporary expansion to this grant program and support the ski racing community with a record \$129,000 awarded in matching grants to clubs & teams.

Safety equipment granted this year will benefit over 13,000 racers in competition and training.

In May, the KBF hosted the inaugural Inspire NYC at City Vineyard on Pier 26 in Tribeca. KBF Executive Director, Edie Perkins, spent 15 years as part of the prolific running and cycling communities of New York, and we are excited to partner with the active communities in NYC to continue to build support for the KBF.

BAY AREA - \$160,000

In October, the KBF hosted Inspire Bay Area at the Olympic Club in San Francisco. The Club served as a stunning venue for cocktails & hors d'oeuvres, socializing, and a Q&A with several members of the growing Bay Area SCI sports community.
