DEAR FRIENDS,

I will always remember 2020 for the good and the bad, but the memory that is most powerful may be how our KBF community stepped up to our collective challenge. Not just your support, but the enthusiasm with which you delivered it during uncertain times inspired me, our team, and our whole community.

The year reads like a rollercoaster. We started the year with big plans and ambitions, then hit the brakes hard in March. We were immediately buoyed by our community's enthusiasm and carried that momentum through the rest of the year. I'm so proud that we ended closer to where we hoped we'd be in January than where we feared we'd be in April.

Our first great pivot was cancelling both Inspire!Boston (scheduled for March) and Inspire! Vermont (scheduled for May), which forced us to consider whether we could even hold a spring Active Fund, which is largely funded by these two events. The KBF team and board devised new fundraising strategies which allowed us to fund an impactful, if more humble, spring Active Fund. We were also able to fund a summer Ski Racing Safety grant program.

Our second pivot was reimagining the Kelly Brush Ride as a virtual event. We had big plans for our 15th Annual event, but those quickly changed as we focused on how to capture the spirit of the event and the hearts of our fundraisers without the gathering that inspires us all. I was blown away by the success of this. I could literally feel the energy in the air throughout the entire day knowing people were engaged with the Kelly Brush Ride all around the world, being active for our cause, and raising money to support others in their active dreams.

The third big pivot was cancelling Inspire!SanFrancisco, but then creating a virtual experience instead. We aimed for a smaller audience and worked with our Bay Area advisors to bring together donors, our incredible grant recipient community, and some new supporters into a virtual event that really demonstrated the personal and emotional impact of making sports and recreation available for people with spinal cord injuries.

The theme through all of these events was how much our community stepped up. There were no gatherings or giving habits to inspire people to support. But you supported out of a commitment to our cause and the community we love.

Most importantly, we were able to focus even more acutely on our mission. The importance of the Active Fund became absolutely clear. We have spent more time connecting with others in the spinal cord injury community. We added a KBF Ambassador program to showcase some incredible people and support them in even greater ways. And we doubled down on developing some important tools and programs for the future.

I'm excited to carry the great momentum we have into 2021. We plan to launch a new resource to help the spinal cord injury community engage in sports and activity in an even greater way. As we return to whatever our new normal is. we will continue to reimagine events and the way we interact with our supporters. And I'm excited to enter the next chapter for the KBF with new leadership.

We all got a taste of the emotional challenge of having a spinal cord injury: isolation, uncertainty, and complete despair. But many of us found the positives too: building important relationships, focusing on the people and things that make your life better, and the power of being active.





SKI RACING **SAFETY**

OUR SAFETY MISSION

The Kelly Brush Foundation continues to be the leader in safety in the Alpine ski racing community.

Despite COVID, we held a Ski Racing Safety Equipment grant cycle in the summer because we projected that the safety challenges faced by programs would be even greater when racers returned to the slopes in 2020/ 2021. We distributed hundreds of Bleeding Control Kits, both free and purchased, as part of our leadership in the Stop The Bleed initiative for the Alpine community. And we continued to work with US Ski and Snowboard to develop and disseminate safety materials and presentations.

As we look to grow the impact of our mission to prevent injuries in Alpine ski racing, we are pushing initiatives into areas of the sport that where we have not traditionally led the conversation while continuing to maintain and improve on the progress we've made with clubs, coaches, parents, volunteers, and officials.
